Dear Members of the Burwood East Primary School Community,

As I walk around our school visiting classrooms and talking with students, I see teachers combine the traditional with the innovative, where students communicate, collaborate, think critically and utilise creativity to explore possible outcomes in their learning.

Our students' access to information is increasing, and memorising facts is less important today than in the past. Although academic skills remain important at our school, they are not sufficient to foster thoughtful, productive, and engaged citizens. Young people everywhere need to develop a greater breadth of skills to evaluate and apply knowledge in ways that meet the new demands of our changing social and economic landscape.

At Burwood East Primary School, we have a strong focus on developing consistent, high quality educational practices using evidence based research to enable staff to put students at the centre of their learning. With increased opportunities to embed innovative learning skills and strategies in teaching and learning programs, students are supported to become determined and assessment capable learners. With our school commitment of ensuring that our whole school approaches are embedded in the language and actions of everyone at our school, our students remain at the centre of every decision that we make. Through a range of DT tools, using classroom space and furniture more flexibly and the engagement of communication platforms like COMPASS, we are opening up to new worlds of learning, paving the way for students to connect and collaborate with their peers and with you, their parents.

For me the weekly walk through of our school reaffirms to me that our students are of the mindset of not thinking of things, but thinking about them. Burwood East Primary School continues to work towards an environment where its students are held back by nothing except the scope of their imagination.

There is always fantastic highlights of the school year with Book Week certainly amongst the best. Every year at Burwood East Primary School there is a celebration of books and special book-related activities for students arranged across the year levels. Students delight in dressing up as their favourite book character. Parades, dancing, drawing, singing and working with the short-listed Book Council Junior Fiction Picture Books is always a special focus for this week.



It is great to see so many students either riding a bike or scooter to school. With the focus “healthy life-styles” and the limited access to parking around the school it is a win-win for everyone. All bike and scooter riders are required to wear a bike helmet in Victoria when riding:

NAPLAN

The 2018 National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) results for Year 3 and 5 students will be available on Thursday August 30th. The results of the NAPLAN tests provide diagnostic information for parents and teachers about a child’s performance in Literacy and Numeracy. This information is used to support our teaching and learning programs and improve student achievement. Please remember that the NAPLAN tests are just a ‘snapshot’ of student performance and are conducted under test conditions within short timelines in May. Parents are encouraged to contact their child’s teacher should they have any questions about the results.

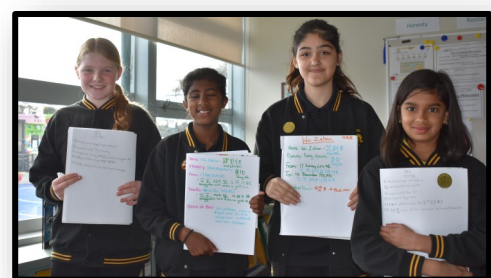

Assistant Principal's Report

Hi everyone,

It has been an action packed two weeks at Burwood East Primary School. Our students have been busy completing their work on the Procedure text-type which linked in well with our Science curriculum. I've enjoyed seeing many classes making a big mess in the Science room by participating in a range of experiments! This week, staff have been meeting to moderate and evaluate student writing across the whole school. Moderation allows us to develop consistent teacher judgements and identify student's success and areas for future growth. Students will now be focusing on the Response text-type for the remainder of the term.

Last Friday, I was fortunate enough to witness our Year 6 students participating in their Winter Round Robin sports day. It was great to see the level of respect the students were showing for their peers and their opponents. I'd like to acknowledge Beth, Daniel and Shona for their organisation and support. These days provide many students with opportunities to try new sports and participate in a competitive environment.

ICAS

The final ICAS test (Numeracy) has been completed as of last week. Students should receive their results in the upcoming weeks. In 2018, we have had around 80 students sit 400 tests across the areas of Digital Technologies, Science, Spelling & Grammar, Writing, Reading and Numeracy. Thank you to Charlotte who has coordinated the assessments for our Year 2 – 6 students throughout the year.

Student Banking

Many families would be aware we have been working with Commonwealth Bank over many years to support student banking in the school. During Term 2, School council recommended a review into the program and how it fits in with the current programs within the school. This review has now been completed and the decision has been made to cease our relationship with Commonwealth Bank at the end of Term 4 2018.

Students and Families can continue to bank with the Commonwealth Bank past this date, however the school will not be collecting or processing any Commonwealth Bank books in 2019 and parents would need to deposit money either online or in person at a Commonwealth branch.

Burwood East Primary School will be partnering with Bendigo Bank in 2019 and beyond. More information will be made available to families regarding this change in the upcoming weeks.

Learning Tasks – Compass

Just a reminder to parents to keep an eye out for "Learning Tasks" becoming available to view over the next few weeks. Parents should receive an email from the teacher when a task is available and will then be able to view their child's work and the feedback they have been given. Please come and see me if you have any difficulties with accessing these tasks once they have become live.

NAPLAN – School Readiness Trial

Next Wednesday our Year 3 and 5 students will be participating in an online trial of NAPLAN as we look to move to the implementation of NAPLAN online in 2019 (except Writing for Year 3). No student assessment data will be collected during this trial.

Student Supervision

I have been noticing over the last few weeks that there are a large number of students on school grounds unsupervised before school (8:00 - 8:30am) and after school (3:45pm). Department of Education guidelines stipulate that schools need to provide supervision for students between 8:45 – 8:55am and from 3:30 – 3:45pm.

Students on school grounds outside the times mentioned above should be signed in to OHSC with Camp Australia. If unforeseen circumstances mean a parent is running late to collect their child, they need to make contact with the school office before 3:30pm. The child will then be asked to wait at the office from 3:45pm. Teachers will be contacting families if their child is left unsupervised in the future.



Digital reputation

All internet users have a digital or online reputation, no matter what their age. This reputation is the opinion or view that others have about the user, based on what they say and do online.

For their privacy and safety, it's important for your children and all young people to be aware of where and how their personal information is available on the internet, who can access it, what others are doing with their information and the impression they are leaving for others to find.

Managing the risks

It is imperative that your children are aware of and understand all of the features and terms of use of social networking sites—in particular, how to set their profile to 'private'.

It's also valuable to help them understand that any information they provide online or via SMS can be shared more broadly than they might think. Even if their profile is set to private, they can't control what their friends will do with the information that they post. Encourage your children to think carefully before sharing images or messages online or on their mobile phone. ^[L]^[SEP]

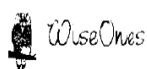

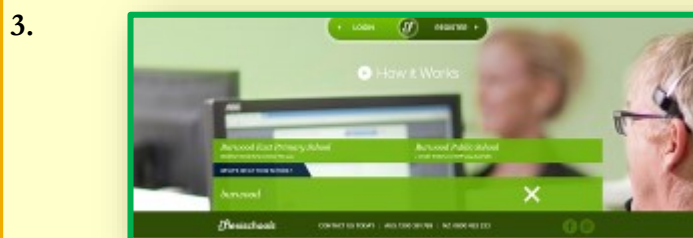

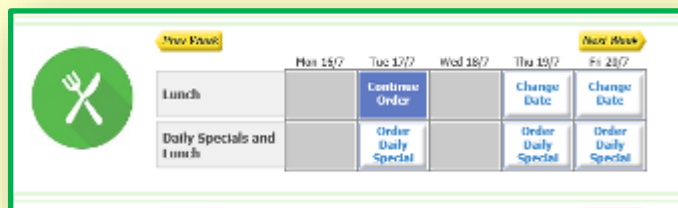
