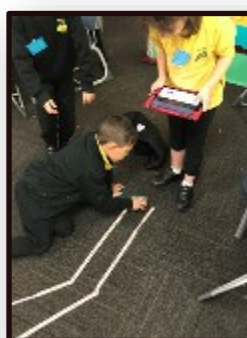

Dear Members of the Burwood East Primary School Community,

It is the Queen's Birthday public holiday on Monday so no school for anyone that day! Our students (and staff!) are in need of some well-earned R&R as it is an academically challenging time of year and they have been working to capacity. Enjoy your day off everyone – we'll see you back on Tues 12th to round out the final three weeks of term.

On Monday and Tuesday this week, both Andrew and I attended the 2018 Regional Leadership Conference. The theme for this year was "Leading excellence in teaching and learning – unleashing greatness together", which provided school leaders with the opportunity to learn and engage with their peers, and global leaders in education. At this year's conference, we were able to discuss aspects of the conference and how they were relevant to BEPS. We were able to positively reflect on many aspects that Department of Education and Training (DET) is focussing on. The main message from the conference was the belief that to assist students to improve their learning and outcomes we must ensure that teachers are also on the learning journey too. To ensure we provide learning opportunities for all students to become successful learners staff regularly participate in a range of activities:

At BEPS, staff participate in the following to ensure we are providing learning opportunities for all students to become successful learners.

- Staff discussions and Professional Learning provide opportunities to share and reflect on best practice and how to implement effective strategies to assist all students to learn.
- To effectively assist students to 'learn' teachers spend time building relationships with their students. Research indicates that students talk about a teacher who has the most impact on their 'learning' as someone who cares and is fair.
- Staff meet in year level teams and across year levels to share student work and assessment to determine student growth and evidence of learning.
- We have a team of three staff members who successfully gained a place in the BASTOW directed INSPIRE (Young Leaders) program. They regularly attend workshops and professional learning and then they share this 'learning' with staff.
- Staff visit other classrooms to observe colleagues delivering their programs, they have an opportunity to 'learn' from others.

Every Day Counts Initiative

Included in this newsletter is an overview of the DET initiative, "Every Day Counts". In essence the initiative involved 3 key aspects:

1. The importance of children attending school every day
2. Ensuring our school is notified of all absences (in advance or on the day) and
3. If our school is not advised, then we must contact families. As adults, we are very cognisant of the importance of attending school every day and also arriving on time. The research is very clear, the more a child misses school, the greater the gap between their peers hence the importance of minimising absences.

A reminder to please ensure you enter any absence into your Compass account when your child is to be absent, arrive late or is to leave early. As always, if you have any queries accessing Compass, please contact Andrew or Wendy.

Getting to school late can impact on your child's education greatly. At present we are noticing a number of students arriving late to school on a regular basis.

Students being late to school can have an effect on the teacher, other students in their class and themselves in the following ways:

- distract other students when they arrive
- miss out on talking to their class teacher before school
- miss out on playing with other children before school
- miss out on setting up and organisation time
- may be marked absent on the roll and may miss out on having notices taken to the office
- miss out on hearing what's happening in the day ahead
- are often unsure about what they have to do in a lesson and that may mean the teacher has to repeat instructions and give extra attention to the latecomer
- tend to not value punctuality
- miss out on valuable teacher instruction time
- can arrive at their classroom and find their grade at a specialist class or elsewhere in the school
- particularly miss out on discussions and valuable reading, writing and mathematics learning time in the mornings

It is important that you use a computer to make bookings -not the app on a device or phone. Reports will be available to parents via Compass on Friday 22nd June. Parents will need to contact the school (teacher) if they require a paper report.

We are now starting to make predictions about next year's numbers and I would like to ask all current families who have a child starting Foundation next year to please strongly consider grabbing an enrolment form from Wendy and getting it back to us as soon as possible. This will help us enormously with our planning for 2019. Enrolment forms are also available on the school website.

The Sick Child

A reminder that despite all precautions, common illnesses are easily spread as the children work and play in close contact with each other. Although it may seem obvious, children should not go to school when they are contagious to others, when they have a fever and when they're too sick to learn. Childhood illnesses are easily spread when children are in close contact in the school setting.

In the past few weeks, I have noted that students are coming to school sick. If your child has a very runny nose, vomiting and/or diarrhoea, a temperature or they are generally lethargic they should be kept at home and rested. Sick children should not return to school until at least 24 hours after the symptoms cease. Sending your child to school may not make them worse, but it will increase the likelihood that the infection will spread to classmates and friends.

According to the Victorian Statutory requirements, if the child is experiencing certain symptoms such as cold like symptoms, and symptoms of hand, foot and mouth disease, they must be excluded from school until the symptoms have ceased. If your child has diarrhoea or vomiting they must stay away from school and child care for a minimum of 24 hours from the last bout of vomiting and/or diarrhoea.

It is important that children who attend school are healthy and well. Your assistance with this matter would be greatly appreciated.

I would like to congratulate the five students (Anneliese, Milly, Konstantinos , Liana, and Anidhya) who represented Cross Country for Syndal District and a special mention to Anneliese who continues to excel at this level finishing first in her age group. A super effort!

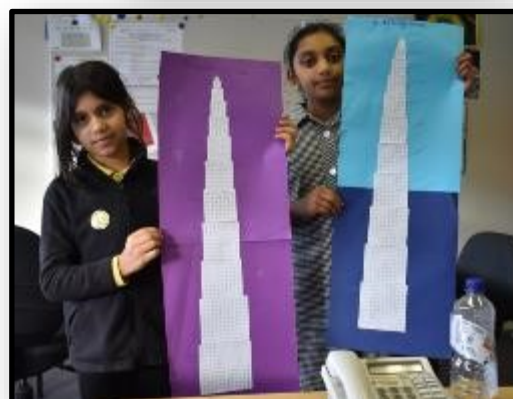

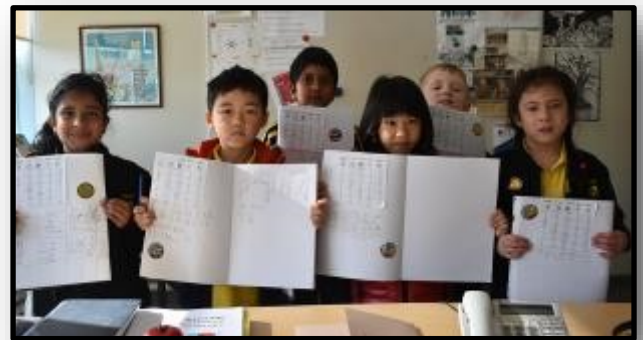

Assistant Principal's Report

Hi everyone,

What an exciting time it has been over the last few weeks. I wanted to start off by thanking Beth Cleary (PE) for all her work in continuing to develop the Physical Education Program at Burwood East and creating strong links with our local community. Beth has organised a wide range of clinics for students to experience a range of sports. Recently, we have had SEDA (Basketball), Forest Hill College (Soccer) and Lacrosse clinics which our students have thoroughly enjoyed. This again supports our approach at Burwood East of developing a wide range of skills in our students.

Last week, I also had the opportunity to support the Year 4 students who completed the Attitude to School Survey for the first time. This survey in Years 4-6 allows students to give feedback on the school and the teachers in an anonymous fashion. I feel really privileged to be part of a community where students are positive, creative and passionate, which really showed up when hearing our students discuss how they felt about our school environment. The results from the survey are made available later in the year, at which time we will provide that information to our wider community.

This week, I was fortunate enough to attend the North Eastern Regional Principal's conference with Darren in the CBD. Over two days, we heard from a number of international speakers discussing current research and priorities in education. A lot of what was discussed was affirming of many of the programs and structures that we have at Burwood East Primary School. This includes a strong focus on student voice and providing students with opportunities to guide their own learning. Rochelle and Karen have been supporting our staff in continuing to develop this focus through our Inquiry investigations. One key message that came from the conference is that as educators we need to be life long learners and continue to strive for improvement. This is a belief our staff are strongly committed to.

Team Kids – Holiday Program

As our school has continued to grow, one of the challenges we have faced is supporting our community in providing an Out of Hours School Care program. Over the last few weeks, Darren and I have met with a number of providers around setting up a school holiday program at Burwood East Primary School. After consultation with school council we have decided to work with Team Kids as the provider of a program for this school holidays.

Team Kids have provided a high level of communication and a commitment to the same values we have at Burwood East Primary School. Information about the holiday program is attached in the Buzz and has been made available through Compass. Team Kids are also running a free Coffee Van event next Friday 15th from 3pm to meet our community and discuss the program with parents. We hope that the holiday program will provide the support needed for many of our families over those two weeks and continue into the future.

Parking

As I mentioned in the previous newsletter, there has been a change to the parking restrictions outside the school on Highbury Road between the main school gate and Worthing Ave. This means parents only have 2 minutes to park during the mornings and afternoons on school days and must stay within 3 metres of their car. Whitehorse Council are being vigilant in enforcing the parking laws in the area so again, I strongly encourage parents to follow the road rules to ensure the safety of our local community and students.

Balance Living – Lunch Orders

Parents may be aware that 'Miss Peppercorn' is ending their association with Burwood East Primary School so we have looked at other providers. At this point in time we will be using Balance Living Catering to provide lunch orders on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. Just a reminder that parents will be able to book online through Compass for 3-way conferences (interviews) with their child's teacher. These conferences allow students to share some of their learning from the semester and allow parents to have communication with the teacher around the student reports which are made available on Friday 22nd of June (Except for FB, which will have their conferences in early Term 3). Finally, I just wanted to inform the community that next Thursday 14th June will be my final day for the Term as I had previously organised Long Service leave prior to starting at Burwood East Primary School. 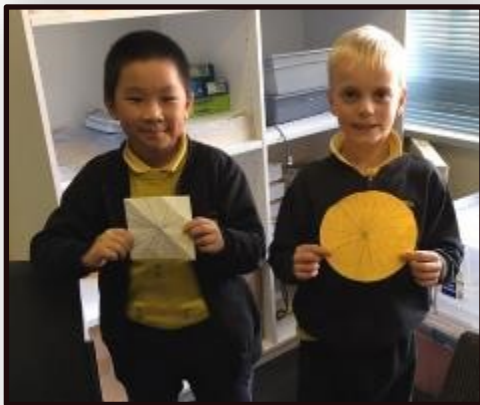

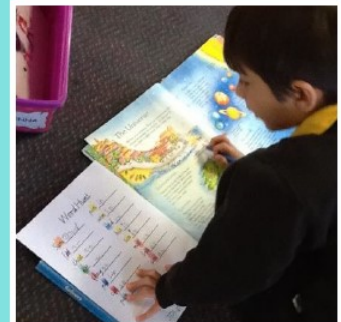
Congratulations to the five students who represented the Syndal District in the Cross Country on Thursday 7th of June, at Nortons Park.

In **Foundation M** we have been practising our reading strategies during CAFE reading groups.

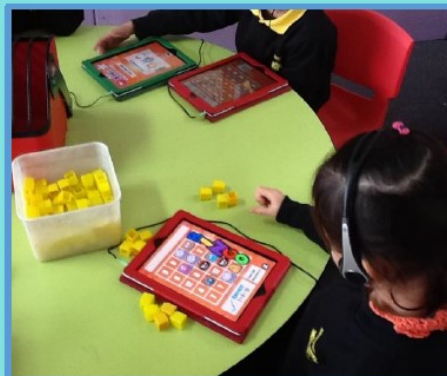


During Inquiry Investigations, we have explored the way objects move using magnets, levers, spinning objects, floating and sinking, push and pull forces.

Supporting your child online - *the home environment*

In order to protect their reputation, both online and offline, young people need to consider how they manage their own and others' messages and images. Some tips to help facilitate this conversation are:

- Talk to your children about managing personal information on social networking sites. Encourage them not to put any personal information on their profiles. This includes their phone number, personal email address, home or school addresses, or the name of their school.
- Remind your children that much of what they do online can be made public, and may go beyond the group of friends they intend it to reach. *A good general guide is for kids not to post photos that they would not want strangers to see.*
- Encourage your children to be careful when they post photos and to consider how what they post might be viewed by others. Encourage them to think about who might see the content and what the impact might be, now and in the future.
- Remind them to take care with others' digital reputations. They should not post images of others without their permission and should take care with comments about others.

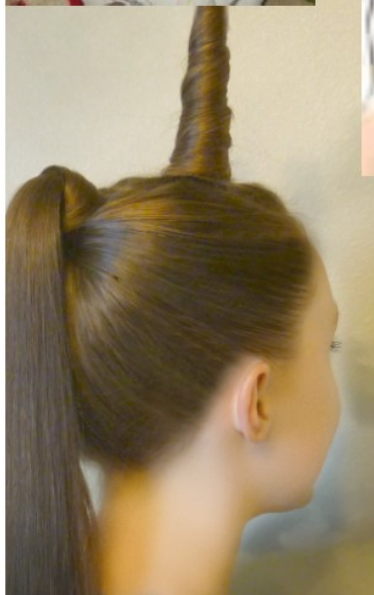

Keeping imagination alive in Primary School kids

Kids spend most of the day in classrooms learning concepts and practising skills. But if you wander past the school at lunchtime, you'll see them gallivanting through the playground kicking a ball or setting up a "shop" in the sandpit.

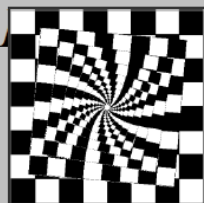
