Transition 2019

I would like to start off by congratulating our 2019 Foundation students and parents for their participation in the first transition sessions held last Tuesday. Starting primary school is a significant milestone for each child and their family. Our program consists of four transition sessions, one orientation session prior to the start of 'real school' (Tuesday December 11) and an evening Parent Information session (Thursday November 1).

The program assists our future Foundation students to become familiar with the teachers, their peers and some of the facilities and programs at Burwood East Primary School. It also provides our teachers with the opportunity to know each child, build connections with parents and inform our planning for next year. The transition program plays an important part in each child's transition to primary school and we look forward to seeing everyone again at the next session in October (Wednesday 17).

A big thanks to Melissa, Blake, Elisa, Vikki and Wendy who set the foundations for our school to implement such an excellent program.

China Tour

Monday marked the beginning of our Year 5/6 Tour to China with Darren, Melissa and Daniel D accompanying eight of our students on their two-week tour. The students have already had a great time visiting historical sites such as the Great Wall of China and Forbidden City. The students will continue to be immersed in a range of cultural activities and spend time with their host family and sister school. OHSC (Camp Australia and Team Kids)

Starting next term, Camp Australia will be running their program out of the school hall on a permanent basis. Providing this larger and more flexible space will support us in ensuring a larger number of places for bookings. This reflects the demand we have from our school community and supports the growth from within our school.

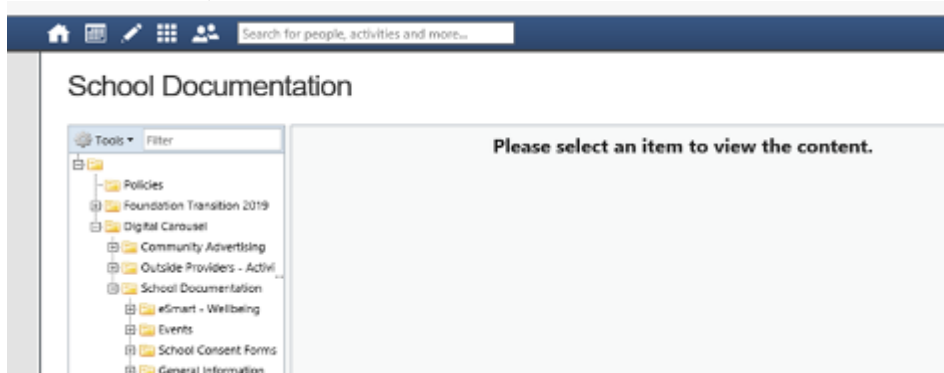
Also, just a reminder that Team Kids will be running a holiday program again these holidays except for the Friday Public Holiday. Parents can make bookings online to register.

Bike Ed

Over the last few weeks Sue has taken our Year 4 students for Bike ED, focusing on developing students riding and safety skills. It has been great to see the enthusiasm of all students involved. This program helps to support our students in being healthy and active by riding to school on a regular basis. The year 3-6 students all receive an opportunity to develop their riding skills further through our camping program in Term 4.

Forest Hill College Visit

This week our Year 5 students visited Forest Hill College to participate in a range of Secondary school activities which enables them to experience a day in a different environment. Students were provided with opportunities to experience classes such as Drama, Physical Education and STEM and gave great feedback on the day. Thank you to Forest Hill College for hosting our students and Daniel A for organising the event.



Planning Week

Last week all of our teachers had time to plan the learning for our students in term 4. These planning days allow our teachers to work collaboratively to develop engaging and challenging learning activities for our students. The key theme for Inquiry Investigations in Term 4 will be focusing on natural and synthetic resources.

Shade Sails

Life Education – Term 4

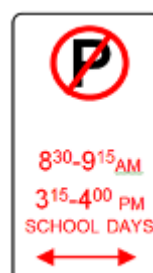
Harold is Back! Next term we will be involved with the Life Education program (see Compass for event information). In partnership with schools, Life Education delivers a curriculum based program to Preschools, Primary and Secondary schools. Visiting over 710,000 children every year, it endeavours to support students to achieve learning outcomes in Health education.

Kiss and go (Drop off zone) Highbury Road

Based on feedback from families we have arranged with the Whitehorse Council to have installed some Kiss & Go signs near our school in the 'No Parking' zone.

Drivers are allowed to stay inside or within three metres of their car for up to two minutes for the quick pick up and drop off of students. Disabled Permit holders can park for up to five minutes. When parking elsewhere, please don't encourage children to run across the road to meet you at your vehicle. Cross the road to meet them safely using the crossing at Blackburn Road.

Children should also enter and exit vehicles on the kerb side only, and not on the road side of the vehicle, where oncoming traffic may be a danger. Creating safe conditions for children around schools is something that we are all responsible for.

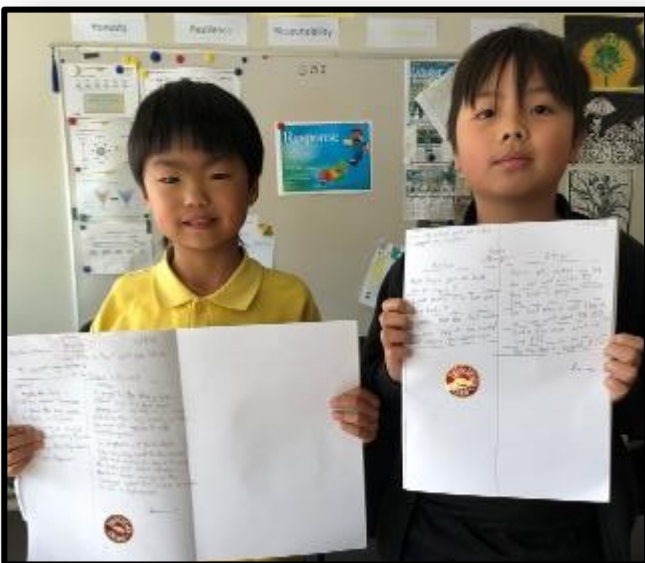
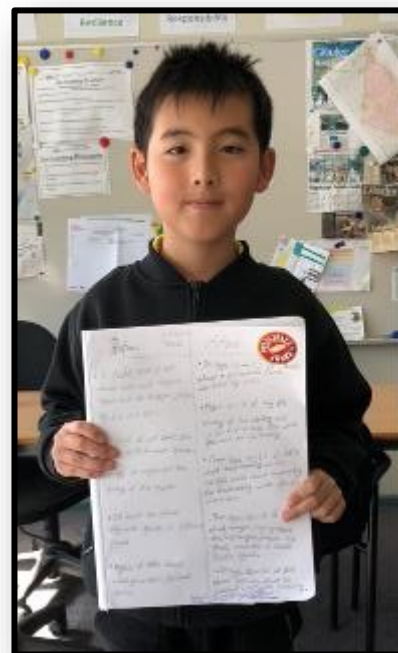
Principal Learning Awards

For the last two weeks the Year 3 & 4 classes have been working on 'inference'. This is where you read deeper to find out what might be happening from clues in the text. Inferences are generally not spelt out in the text but rather hinted at with clues. The students use evidence from the text to support their inferences.

The Year 3 & 4 teachers set up 'crime scenes' in their classrooms for the students to observe and infer from. Below are some of the inferences written by the Year 3s. This scene was also used to encourage their creativity in writing.

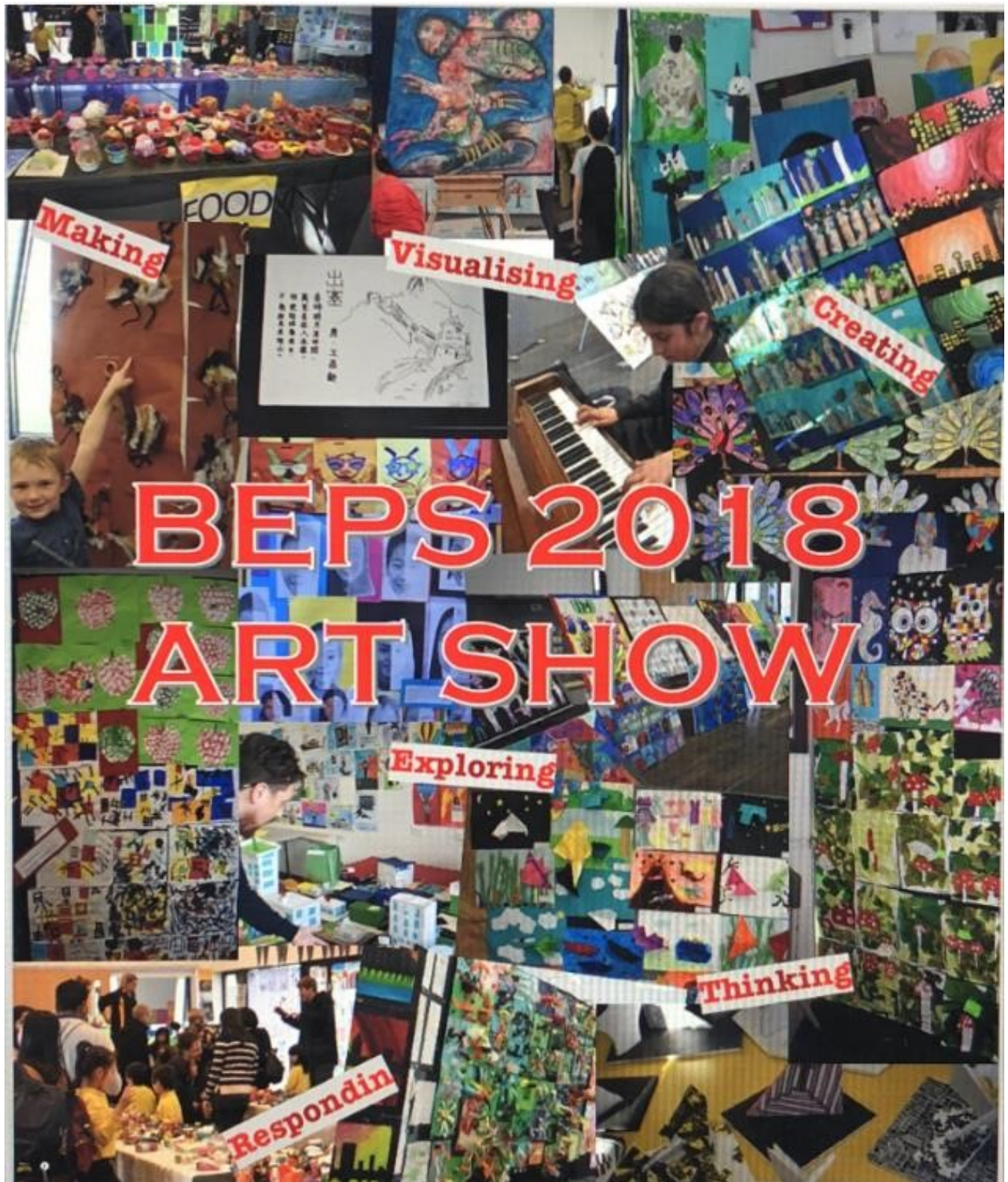

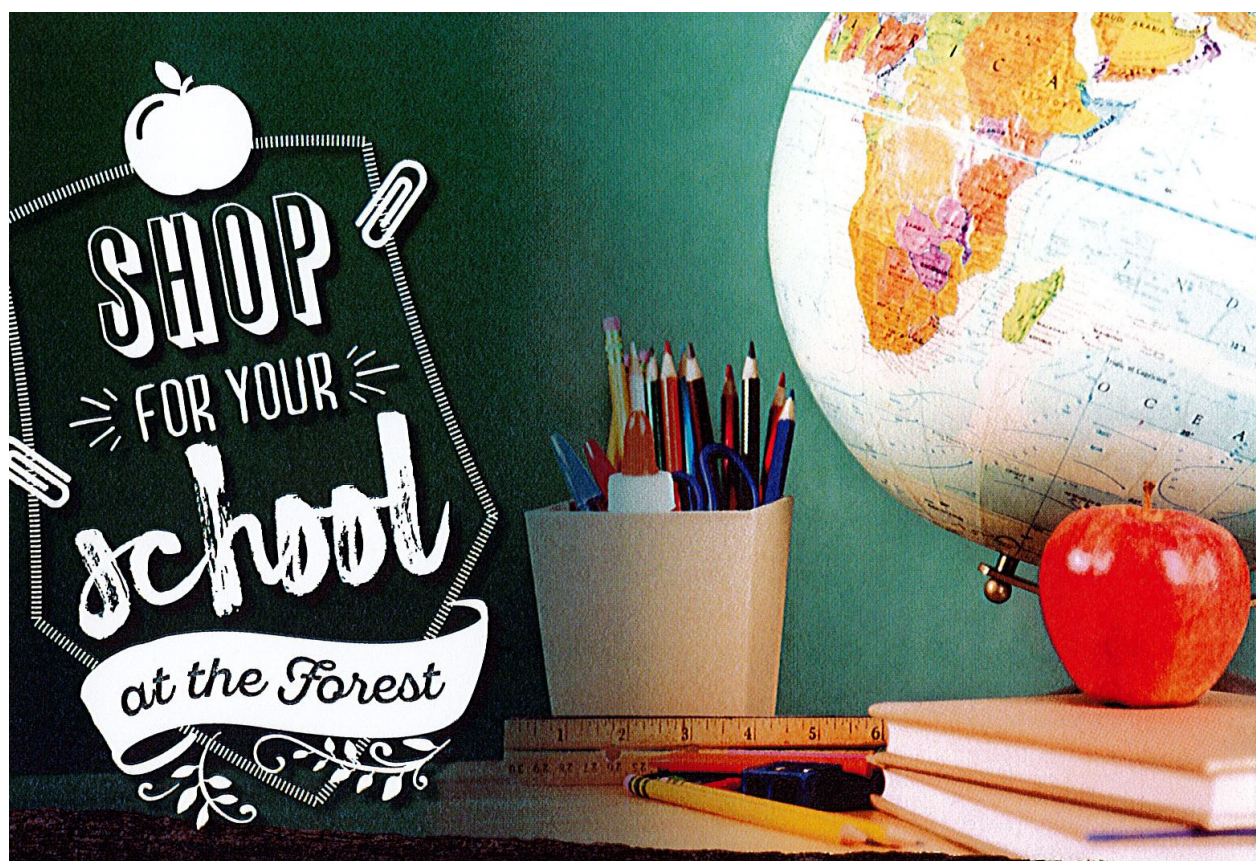
