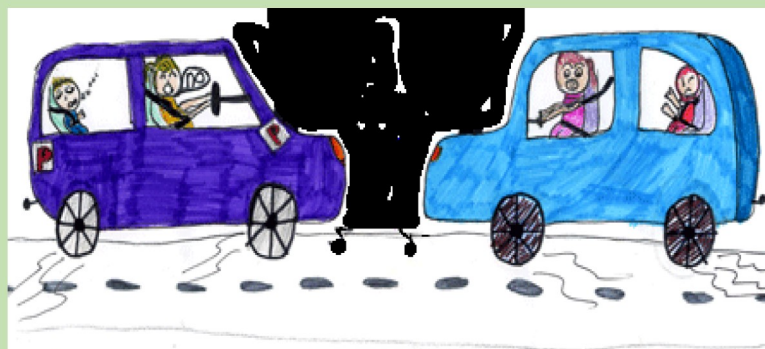
Community Engagement

Avoid the Pitfalls of Labelling Kids

Recently I came across an article and I really liked the message so I thought I would share it with you, as I have seen the damage and the ongoing issues caused through labelling children. I have seen children cry with the pressure of feeling they have to be smarter and better than other students and I have seen other children give up before they even start something because in their hearts they feel the outcome is predetermined –they will fail or not do as well as others. What pressure to feel at a young age! Unfortunately these feelings give way to excuses for certain behaviours – “I didn’t do my project because I know that it will be terrible” or “Yes I pushed him over- I’m the naughty one in my family”.

People are natural labellers. We’re quick to categorise others, particularly when they hold different views to ourselves. Terms such as ‘racist’, ‘feminist’ and ‘socialist’ are used liberally at the moment.

The trouble with placing a label on a person is that it stops us from thinking too deeply about what they’re saying and prevents us from understanding who they really are. It’s hard to see beyond the label.

The same principle applies when we apply labels like these on kids:

“She’s the bright one of the family.”

“My child is the one on the autism spectrum.”

“He’s such a naughty kid.”

“She’s an only child.”

“He’s shy.”

The labels we place on kids can become their defining characteristics. Anyone who has been called ‘stupid’, ‘tanglefoot’ or a ‘klutz’ will know that these tags can become an overriding narrative, remaining well into adulthood. “I’m hopeless with accounts. I was a klutz in maths when I was a kid and I’m still hopeless with figures,” is an example of a self-limiting storyline that has its origins in childhood.

Even positive labels can be a burden for some children. Be told often enough that you’re the ‘smart’, the ‘good’ or the ‘responsible’ child of the family or class and you’ve got some lofty expectations to live up to. There’s nothing wrong with setting high behavioural or academic standards, but a child’s good behaviour or high achievement shouldn’t become a badge or label that they always have to wear.

Foundation Transition Program

Our formal Foundation Transition Program has commenced. This program is only for children who have been enrolled in Foundation for 2018 and their parents. During this Transition Program, whilst the children are in small activity groups becoming more familiar with their primary school environment, parents are being provided with information in relation to the running of the school, the Foundation Program and how they can assist their child to have a smooth start to their primary school life. Riding our Bikes to School

Term 4 Curriculum Day - Monday 6th November

Just a reminder that, Monday 6th November is a School Council approved Curriculum Day. During this day, teachers will be reviewing and analysing student achievement data and work samples in preparation for writing student end of year reports. Please ensure you make alternative arrangements for the care of your children on this day.

Semester 2 Reports

Once again, it is report-writing time. For schools, this is a celebration of student achievements over the semester; it is rewarding to be able to talk to you about growth and achievements and to look forward to 2018 learning targets. The actual preparation for report writing is quite a mammoth task! As we know, teachers collect a huge amount of anecdotal and summative data over a year, and prepare for this to readily be available during the writing process. Behind the scenes, Sue Varey sets up the reporting template. Learning Assessment statements are prepared, and inserted into the report writing template. Reports are made available on our management system for teachers to access for their class or specialist program.

Teachers are continually discussing and crosschecking data with their colleagues. Teachers consider consistency of marking within and across teaching teams and enter into moderation discussions, validating their results with each other and examples of work provided by Victorian Curriculum. It is a rigorous process but very satisfying to know that what has been written on the report you will receive is a true reflection of learning progress and future learning goals. Another staff member (Writing Buddy) beside the writer check reports as we rarely see our own mistakes, and computer grammar check can be sometimes highly misleading. All reports are checked by a member of leadership. When your report becomes available online on Friday, December 15th you can be sure that it does reflect learning for this semester and also imagine the huge sigh of relief and the celebration by teachers of another round of reporting completed.

Getting Ready for Secondary College

I'm sure we all remember those days when our children were at pre-school and the excitement of 'going to school after the holidays'.

Getting 'ready' for secondary school is just as important. Our children will be moving to a new environment, will be mixing with many new students, working with new teachers, possibly without knowing anything about them and, without the teachers knowing anything about them. No longer are the students the 'big fish in a little pond', in fact, they become the little fish again.

Fortunately, all our students are involved in Secondary Transition Programs to help them prepare for the move into Year 7. For most of our students, the transition activities involve the school they will attend. For those moving to different schools, the transition program still provides opportunities to find out about what to expect in their new school.

If you need further assistance in getting ready for secondary school next year please feel free to contact the secondary college your child will be attending.

Student Safety

Unless arrangements have been made with our before school care service, it is expected that students will arrive at school at approximately 8.45am, as there are teachers on yard duty from this time until 9am.

It is particularly important for safety reasons that children are not walking to school alone after 9.00am. Students who arrive after the 9.00am bell has rung, must be brought to the office by a parent or guardian to be signed in, so that we know that the parent or guardian IS aware that their child is late; otherwise it could be the case that a parent THINKS their child is at school, but are not.

Also, arriving late is disruptive to the child, as well as to other students, and negatively effects the organisation of the class and the ability of the child to quickly settle to set tasks for the day.

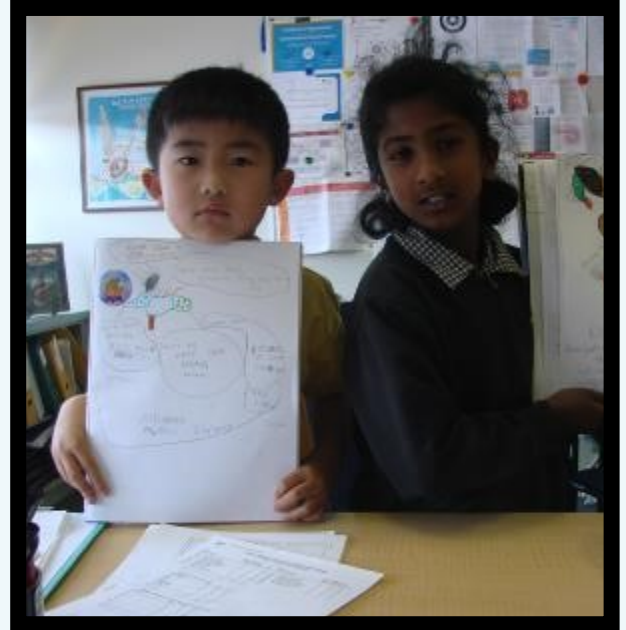

Throughout the year, we have been learning how to program and control the Sphero



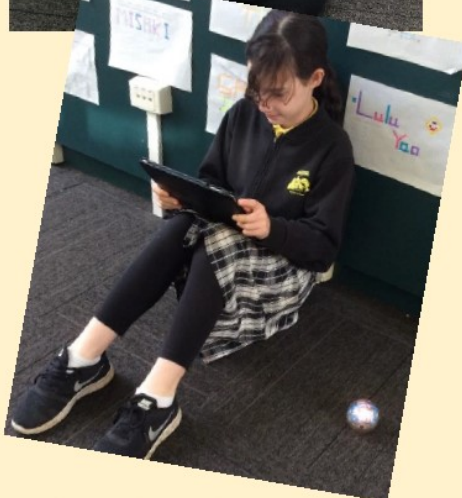

Managing Online Time

There are many ways you can help your child maintain a healthy balance between online and offline activities for the benefit of their health and wellbeing.

Talk to your kids

Monitor the games, apps and devices your kids buy and then chat about any concerns you have. Your conversations should also cover positive things, such as what they love in life, careers they are interested in and new hobbies.

Find a balance

Finding balance is so important and you can help your kids with that by encouraging a mix of non-screen entertainment and socialising opportunities.

Set screen time limits

Set clear rules about when and for how long your child can play games or use the internet. It may take time to strike a balance but a minor reduction each day or '15-minutes to switch-off' warning can help the transition. Reducing your own screen time also sets a positive example.

Create a screen time plan

Involve your kids in a family screen time plan to help set clear boundaries and balance online and offline activities. It could include an agreed age-based screen time schedule, rules about what websites can be visited and electronic games can be played (with clear consequences for breaking those rules), and control of access to the internet with daily passwords revealed once family time, homework and chores are complete. Where possible, try to avoid using screen time as a punishment as this approach may inflate its importance to children.

Filter their access

You may like to install a filter on the device your child is using that can be adjusted to limit the amount of time an internet connection will be available.

Open location for devices

Try to locate the devices that your kids use in a shared or visible place in the home.

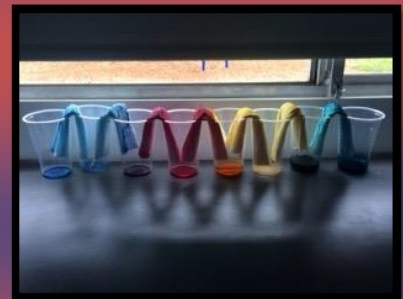

What is GATEWAYS?

G.A.T.E.WAYS runs a range of programs which parents of gifted and highly able children can enrol in directly. These programs include: Brainwaves Club, Holiday Club, Festivals and Leadership.

Why GATEWAYS?

G.A.T.E.WAYS aims to cater for children who are in the highly able to gifted range. This approximates the top 10 – 15% of children in the classroom. Programs are delivered at a faster pace than in the regular classroom, and are pitched around two years ahead of chronological age.

What does Burwood East Primary School offer?

At Burwood East, GATEWAYS offers two programs that run through the school terms.



When attending a day-long Eureka program, children participate in three hands-on workshops based on a theme. Each term the theme changes to focus on a different curriculum area. Previous themes have included '*Curious Science*,' '*You Can Count On Maths*,' '*History Matters*,' '*What Nonsense*,' '*Secret Maths*,' and '*Grossology*.'



Journeys are extended programs for highly able children. They attend once a week for four half days and explore a topic in depth. Subject matter is wide-ranging and is often in areas not always taught in the primary school curriculum. Participants as young as six can become detectives solving hypothetical mysteries, work as archaeologists on a 'dig', explore the wonders of the universe, the mathematics of infinity, the world of the brothers Grimm or Gothic literature, or take part in a philosophical 'community of inquiry'. The possibilities are unlimited.

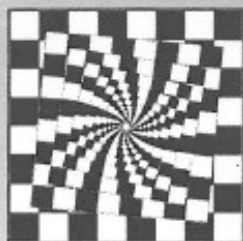
